Tour the Parliament Buildings with Francis Rattenbury

Bring your class on a Friday this spring to take advantage of this special opportunity!

In 1892, an architectural contest was held to select a design for the new Parliament Buildings. Of 65 sets of drawings submitted by competitors from across North America, those of 25-year-old architect Francis Rattenbury were selected. Born and trained in England, Rattenbury had arrived in British Columbia only months before winning the architectural contest.

Construction began in 1893 and the Parliament Buildings were officially opened in 1898. Following their completion, Rattenbury went on to design a number of Victoria's landmarks including the famous Empress Hotel (1904-1908) and the C.P.R. Steamship Terminal (1923-1924). He also found success beyond the provincial capital, designing prominent public buildings in Nanaimo, Rossland, New Westminster, Nelson and Vancouver.

On Fridays this spring, the colourful character of Francis Rattenbury is being brought to life for school groups by one of the Parliamentary Players. Reference this opportunity when booking online and your students can explore the Parliament Buildings on a tour led by the man himself!

A New Home for the Parliamentary Gift Shop


The Parliamentary Gift Shop has moved to its own purpose-built space adjacent to the front exit of the Parliament Buildings.
