The Parliament Buildings continue to be a popular destination for school groups from around the province. Last year, we were busier than ever delivering 506 tours to school groups for over 21,000 students!

As over 70% of school groups come in the months of April, May and June, we encourage you to consider visiting at other times in the school year. Visiting during our slower periods makes it easier for you to book a guided tour and offers students a better educational experience as there are fewer groups in the building.

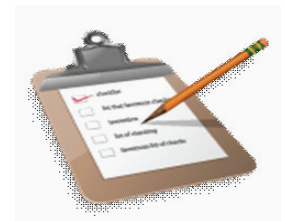

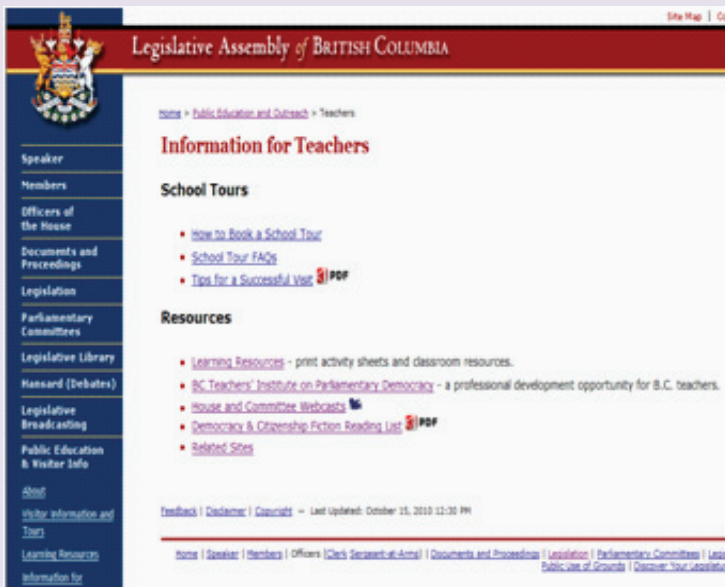

New Educational Resources

A new Information for Teacher's page has been created to provide you with a single point of access to all of our learning resources and information on how to visit the Parliament Buildings with your class. The following are some of the highlights of what you'll find on the page:



- Download our new Legislative Chamber poster to show your students the layout of the Legislative Assembly available in English or French
- Download a Self-Guided Tour Book to learn more about the Parliament Buildings. Self-Guided Tour Books are available in English, French, Dutch, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Chinese (Simplified and Traditional), Portuguese, Punjabi and Spanish. Our newest language is Russian – made available in January 2011. There is also a tour book for ESL students.

Visit the Related Sites section of the Information for Teachers page for an extensive collection of links to other Legislative Assemblies and Government organizations from across Canada and around the world. Many of the sites have excellent information (and free resources) for you to use in the classroom.

- The Library of Parliament in Ottawa has a new website that gives access to all of the historical debates in both the Senate and the House of Commons, available in both official languages. Historical debates now available online too.

In addition to regular House proceedings, video of special events such as Royal Visits and the Speech from the Throne are also available.

All proceedings of the Legislative Assembly are also now available in a Mobilecast format, which is designed for viewing on handheld devices such as BlackBerry, iPhone, iPod Touch and iPad.
